### 2.5.1 Europe for citizens

	Europe for Citizens Programme 2014-2020
PROGRAMME/CALL	Europe for Gitizens i Togramme 2014-2020
Programme	Europe for Citizens, the new European Programme which promotes European citizenship and improves the conditions for democratic and civic participation at EU level.
	Europe for Citizens will substantially follow the homonymous 2007-2013 Programme, with a simplified structure.
	Its goal is to promote civic participation, help to raise citizens awareness and knowledge of the European Union to bridge the gap that sometimes exists between them and the European institutions.
	The new Europe for Citizens 2014-2020 is composed by 2 strand:  1. European remembrance  2. Democratic engagement and civic participation, which is divided in 3 specific measures:  — Town Twinning;  — Networks of towns;  — Civil society projects.
	The two strands shall be complemented by the <u>horizontal actions:</u> <u>"Valorisation"</u> for analysis, dissemination and use of project results.
Objectives and priorities	In addition to them, the Programme will also cofinance Operating Grants providing financial support for regular and usual activities of an organisation.
	<ul> <li>To get citizens closer to the European dimension, the general objectives of the Programme are related to:</li> <li>contribute to citizens' understanding of the EU, its history and diversity;</li> <li>foster European citizenship and to improve conditions for civic and democratic participation at EU level.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The specific objectives of the Programme are related to:</li> <li>raise awareness of remembrance, common history and values and the Union's aim that is to promote peace, its values and the well-being of its peoples by stimulating debate, reflection and development of networks;</li> <li>encourage democratic and civic participation of citizens at EU</li> </ul>



level, by developing citizens' understanding of the EU policy making-process and, by promoting opportunities for societal and intercultural engagement and volunteering at EU level.
Priorities for the year 2014 should be taken into consideration when developing projects to be submitted within year 2014, namely:  • For Strand 1 - European remembrance:  - 100 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the start of World War I;  - 25 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall;  - 10 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the European Union enlargement to Central and Eastern Europe.  • For Strand 2 - Democratic engagement and civic participation:  - the elections to the European Parliament;  - the participation of citizens in the democratic life of the European Union;  - deepening the debate on the future of Europe;
The Europe for Citizens Programme promotes projects as follows:  1. European remembrance: This strand will support activities that encourage reflection on European cultural diversity and on common values in the broadest sense, taking into account gender equality.  It aims to finance projects reflecting on causes of totalitarian regimes in Europe's modern history (especially, but not exclusively, Nazism that led to the Holocaust, Fascism, Stalinism and totalitarian communist regimes) and to commemorate the victims of their crimes. The strand will also encompass activities concerning other defining moments and reference points in recent European history.  Projects under this strand should:  - include different types of organisations, such as: local authorities, NGOs, research institutes etc.;  - develop different types of activities, such as: research, exhibitions, public debates, non-formal education etc.  - involve citizens from different target groups;  - be implemented on a transnational level, or with a clear European dimension.  In particular, it will give preference to actions which encourage tolerance, mutual understanding, intercultural dialogue and reconciliation as a means of moving beyond the past and building the future, in particular with a view to reaching the younger generation.  > PARTNERSHIP: project must involve organisations from at least 1 member state. Preference will be given to transnational projects.
This strand supports activities covering civic participation, focusing in particular on European Union policies and initiatives



developing opportunities for mutual understanding, intercultural learning, solidarity, societal engagement and volunteering at EU level. In particular:

- Town Twinning supporting projects bringing together citizens from twinned towns. By mobilising citizens at local and EU levels to debate on concrete issues from the European political agenda, this measure will seek to promote civic participation in the EU policy making process and develop opportunities for societal engagement and volunteering at EU level.
- ➤ PARTNERSHIP: A project must involve <u>municipalities</u> <u>from at least 2 eligible countries</u>, of which at least one is an EU Member State.
  - A project must involve a minimum of 25 invited participants. "Invited participants" are international participants sent by the eligible partner/s.
- Networks of towns providing funding to municipalities and associations working together on a common theme in a long term perspective, and wishing to develop networks of towns to make their cooperation more sustainable. Networks of Towns are expected to:
  - Integrate a range of activities around the subject(s) of common interest to be addressed in the context of the Programme's objectives or annual priorities
  - Have defined target groups for which the selected themes are particularly relevant and involve community members active in the subject area (i.e. experts, local associations, citizens and citizens' groups directly affected by the theme, etc.);
  - Serve as a basis for future initiatives and actions between the towns involved, on the issues addressed or possibly on further issues of common interest.
- ➤ PARTNERSHIP: A project must involve <u>municipalities</u> <u>from at least 4 eligible countries</u>, of which at least one is an EU Member State.
  - A project must involve a minimum of 30% of invited participants. "Invited participants" are international participants sent by the eligible partner/s.
- Civil society projects supporting projects gathering citizens in activities directly linked to EU policies, providing an opportunity for direct participation in the policy making process. This can be achieved at all stages, and with all institutional interlocutors, and includes notably: agenda-setting activities, advocating during the preparation phase and negotiation of policy proposals, providing feedback on relevant initiatives



	that are implemented. To that end, those projects will invite citizens to act together or debate on the annual priority themes of the Programme at local and European level.  A Civil Society Project must include at least two of the following three types of activities:  • Promotion of societal engagement and solidarity: activities able to promoting debate/campaigns/actions on the themes of common interest in the larger framework of the rights and responsibilities of the Union citizens and making the link to the European political agenda and policy making process.  • Gathering of opinions: activities aiming at gathering the individual opinions of the citizens on a specific topic to be yearly defined, favouring a bottom up approach (including the use of social networks, webinars, etc.) and media literacy.  • Volunteering: activities promoting solidarity among Union citizens and beyond.  > PARTNERSHIP: A project must involve organisations from at least 3 eligible countries, of which at least one is an EU Member State.  3. Horizontal action: "Valorisation"  This action will be defined for the Programme overall and will be applicable to both strands 1 and 2.  It will support initiatives that boost the transferability of results, provide better return on investment and increase learning from experience.  The raison d'être of this action is the further 'valorisation' and use of the results of the initiatives launched in order to ensure their lasting effect. It will include 'capacity building' — the development of support measures to exchange best practices, to pool experiences between stakeholders at local and regional levels including public authorities, and to develop new skills, for example through training. The latter could include peer-to-peer exchange, training for trainers, as well as, for example, the
	development of ICT tools providing information on the organisations or projects funded by the Programme.
